

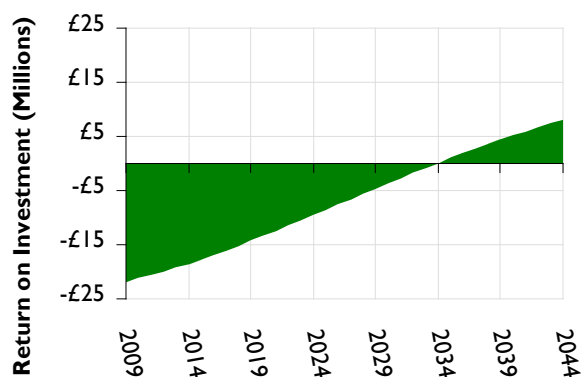
Hopwood Hall College Provides Value for Money for Taxpayers

- Nearly all of Hopwood Hall College learners remain in the UK and contribute to economic growth. Each learner who enters the workforce expands the tax base by generating higher earnings and reducing social costs.
- The UK will save approximately £118,000 in avoided social costs each year, including savings associated with improved health, lower costs of law enforcement, and reduced claims for income assistance.
- Learners enjoy higher earnings after receiving education from Hopwood Hall College, thereby expanding the economic base and reducing the burden on taxpayers. In the aggregate, higher learner income and associated increases in property income generate about £1.5 million in added tax revenue each year.



Hopwood Hall College Generates a Return on Public Investment

Taxpayer Long-Term Investment Growth



- UK government allocated about £22.3 million in support of Hopwood Hall College in Financial Year 2008-09.
- For every pound appropriated by the government, taxpayers will see a return with a cumulative added value of £1.40 in the form of higher tax revenues and avoided social costs attributable to education.
- UK government will receive a rate of return of 6% on their investments in Hopwood Hall College.

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
