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PHOTOGRAPHY COLLAGE ACTIVITY


TASK ONE

TASK TWO



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






25 CIRCLES IDEAS GENERATION EXCERCISE

Artist 'Red Hong Li'





Hong Yi, also known as, 'Red', is an artist who focuses on the reinterpretation of everyday materials for her work through the accumulation of objects. Red studied at the University of Melbourne and TUDelft and holds a Master of Architecture While working as an architect in Shanghai in 2011-2014, Red built installations during weekends from the range of affordable materials available at local wholesale markets. Her artworks featuring portraits of renowned Chinese personalities were featured on publications including Wall Street Iournal, TIME, New York Times, CNBC and Fast Company. Red has been commissioned by clients such as Facebook, Google, Gucci, Chase IP Morgan and the Mandarin Oriental, and exhibited pieces at the World Economic Forum (Davos), Anchorage Museum (Alaska), Design Miami (Miami) and the Asian Art Museum (San Francisco). Sotheby's Institute has named her one of the "11 art world entrepreneurs you should know" in 2018.

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Red HONG YI - Artist statement

'I create installations and paintings by experimenting with everyday objects around me that invite viewers to consider their perceptual habits and preconceptions. I investigate the connection between objects (socks, chopsticks, paint, wax), arrangement (layering, stacking, fanning) and physical action (breaking, burning, tearing, weaving). My work often portrays contemporary figures, social issues and my Chinese-Malaysian lineage, and often in techniques of patterning, systemic repetition and grids. My move to Shanghai in 2011 gave me sudden accessibility to abundant materials through platforms like Alibaba and wholesale markets. My current work focuses on contemporary issues faced by Asian females using cracked eggshells, a craft material used in East Asia and South East Asia. I utilise social media to spread my ideas internationally as I continue in the exploration of my Chinese-Malaysian identity in a globalised society.'


